Message from the HFF Team

On March 25 2021 when we screened Joel Burke's "Beyond The Ashes" and North Eleven's "1979 La Soufrière Eruption" we had no idea what was coming a few weeks later. At 8:41am on April 9th La Soufrière erupted for the 3rd time in living memory casting a very different light on the films we screened just weeks before. Within hours, a plume of ash 32,000ft high towered over the island. The awe many people experienced after the first blast quickly faded away as the volcano continued to erupt and the ash fell thick as snow. A surreality set in as Vincentians tried to process the bizarre situation; a volcanic eruption in the midst of an ongoing global pandemic. Approximately 16.000 Vincentians were evacuated from their homes to shelters and private residences where they would remain for up to 6 months after the eruption.

Everyone prayed for rain to wash the ash away, but when the rain came it came for more than ash. The sheer volume of ash mixed with the rain formed huge rivers of slush called lahars. These lahars cascaded down slopes consuming everything in their path, including in some cases, people's homes.

Most of the HFF team were abroad when the volcano erupted, experiencing this via the internet and being host to a strange range of emotions. Compelled by our own sense of social justice and inspired by the many individuals and organizations that were swinging into action, we launched a fundraising campaign. All funds went to supporting grass roots initiatives and purchasing emergency items.

We believe that art can play a supportive role in social healing. As we connect over shared narratives through Caribbean films we can feel safer, more protected in a shared humanity and in many ways feel more at home. HFF 2022 'Coming Home' honours the sanctity of the home, and more specifically that place within all of us that longs for safety and security. One year later, most of the displaced have been able to return to their homes. Although the road to recovery from the eruption is long we are filled with pride at the resilience of Vincentian people.

Thank you to our partner Soho House, with whom we are collaborating on the first ever script-to-screen competition in SVG. Presently we are in the pre-production stage for the winning film, "Cart Man" by Vincentian author Grace Peters-Clarke. Special thanks to supporting partner Argo Development Studio, and In-Kind Partners Grow In Time, Island Rebel Media, North Eleven and Beachcombers Hotel.

We'd also like to thank Nadia Huggins, Johann Medford, Vonnie Roudette, Jeremy Payne, Sharleen Branch, Kamillo Edwards, Vonley Smith, Jo Addy, Nick Jones, Akley Olton, Colin Browne, Eniye Kagbala and Andrew Williams. Heartfelt thanks also to our audience. We hope you love 'Coming Home' as much as we do.

Film Education and Production Initiatives

At HFF we aren't just about showing films. We have a self-appointed responsibility to support the development of the film sector in St. Vincent and the Grenadines. We care about Vincentian stories and we want to see more Vincies taking up the camera and getting their films seen.

In our opinion, the status of the development of an industry can never be read as a reflection of local talent or ability. We believe that it all comes down to distribution of resources and we help funnel those resources into SVG. We do this, of course, through the messaging in the films we program, informative post-screening Q&As, engaging panel discussions and practical filmmaking workshops. Additionally, we raise finance for Vincentian productions and educational outreach programs.

In 2019, we ran the Hairouna Mentorship Program where we arranged mentorship for an aspiring filmmaker, then 19-year-old Jadiel Foster. In 2021, in collaboration with Soho House, we launched the script-to-screen competition, Hairouna Film Lab, which is the first of its kind offered to Vincentians. Two finalists were taken through a three-week lab where they honed their scripts under the mentorship of accomplished scriptwriters. HFF is currently in pre-production with the winner, Grace Peters-Clarke, on her film "Cart Man", slated for production in August 2022.

This year, we'll be launching the Hairouna Documentary Fund to support the production of documentaries about the 2021 La Soufrière eruption. Interested applicants will be required to attend our producer's workshop with Marva Ollivierre, head facilitator at Business Affairs Resource Booster, where they will also have the chance to be awarded a Doe Eye Media/BARB professional career development

training bursary. The bursary includes a year-long Liaison of Independent Filmmakers Toronto (LIFT) membership, access to three prepaid LIFT workshops, and mentorship support augmented with actionable feedback on selected training, project and career development provided by Marva Ollivierre.
